Britain in Bloom South West Pride in Park Awards 2024.

The parks and green spaces in the South West with the Pride in Parks Award continues to be a great success and the 2023 Awards were presented at the South West in Bloom Seminar at RHS Rosemoor on Thursday 21st March.

Closing date for Park Entries 2024: Monday 10th June

The criteria is the same as last year, and full details are available from our Secretary, or on our website. It is important that the entry is community led, and there will need to be a community representative at the judging. The time allocation can depend on the size of the park or green open space, and can be up to 2 hrs.

Please indicate on the entry form the estimated time needed to judge your entry.

Judging can take place from June until the end of the year, as often parks vary on when their displays are at their best, during the seasons. You will be able to indicate your general preference for when judging takes place, and if you have a special event that you would like judging to tie in with, we will do our best to judge it on a specific day if requested, and if sufficient notice is given. Please provide details on your entry form.

Entries are awarded one to five stars, the five star equating to a Gold Award.

Pride In Park Entry Fee is £30 for 2024 entrants.

Entrants will receive an Award Certificate, together with a plaque to display in your Park.

Glendale are also well on their way to completing 5000 meters of Cornish walling on the A30. Glendale were asked to step in and support when other national builders couldn't support the project. Construction has been ongoing since March 2023 and will continue until October 2024.



The teams on this work have worked tirelessly to produce these stunning walls which will be in place and seen by millions entering Cornwall for many years. Glendale have had up to 14 staff on site over the winter working in the most exposed and challenging weather conditions. Mud rivers and horizontal rain have most certainly been a topic throughout the winter.

Only one entry per age group, per School/Bloom Group can enter, and they should be the winners of your own local competition.

Judging criteria for discretionary award

We are looking for NEW projects for 2024

Projects could be: hedgerow creation, tree planting, establishing a wildflower meadow, wetland creation, creating a pond, wilding a landscape or garden, orchard creation or restoration.

Each NEW project needs to demonstrate end to end sustainability, shown by:

- Management plan with details of how it will be maintained to cover:
- · Plants that are suitable to the soil
- Use of sustainable plant pots
- · Use of natural compost or peat free if purchased.
- Native plants to the area (e.g., hedge that has similar plants to local hedgerows)
- · Watering plan using collected rainwater.
- · Use of traditional hand tools

Community Involvement with the NEW project

Projects which reach out to underrepresented communities or those that have had little access to the countryside and nature are especially welcome.

Bloom in Bristol

My own involvement with Bristol In Bloom started around 15 years ago when I was Allotments Manager for Bristol City Council. Monica Whyte (Secretary of Bristol in Bloom) asked me if I could do a presentation on the Bristol Allotment Strategy for the regional judges. I duly came up with a presentation. After that, I regularly attended Bristol in Bloom Community Association meetings along with other Parks Officers, including the late Dee James who worked in the Council's Clean and Green Team, and was very supportive of getting groups involved in Bloom, especially St George in Bloom, Clifton in Bloom and Fishponds in Bloom. Dee later became Secretary of SW in Bloom of course.



At the time we used to run a school garden competition, and so did Bristol in Bloom. We agreed to combine the two, and a team of judges including myself would spend a whole week going round judging Bristol school gardens, very enjoyable if tiring, the kids were so enthusiastic!

In the main competition, our main

competitors were Plymouth, they were the only city of a similar size to Bristol that used to enter. Mike Crook chaired the Bristol in Bloom meetings, while Monica was Secretary. They also ran the Bristol Flower Show, I remember that Jon Wheatley would come round judging along with Ray Davey (Ray sadly passed away in 2023), they would always give our display a gold or a large gold, just to encourage us! People would often say that the Allotment marquee was the best part of the show, we had allotment holders selling produce from their plots, although sometimes the 'produce' was rather less convincing (pottery or artwork!). One year I took some homemade wine along for people to taste, a group of more mature ladies came back several times for tasters and seemed quite tipsy by the end!

Anyway, Bristol went from achieving Gold in the regional competition (see <u>Bristol wins in South West in Bloom competition - BBC News</u>) to move onto the Nationals, where we also achieved Gold . In 2012 we entered into the Entente Florale, a European version of Bloom. We got a Gold in that as well. The run up to judging was always very hectic, with staff going around the route ensuring that all the grass was cut, and no litter or graffiti visible.

We always had to dress up in our uniforms with blazers and ties for judging day. On the day of the Entente Florale judging, I put up a display on one of our allotment sites at Kennel Lodge Road, near Ashton Court Estate. Luckily it was a beautiful day but rather breezy. The coach with the judges duly turned up. The judges had a few minutes tour around with me and looked at the displays. Just as they were getting back on the coach, a gust of wind came and blew all the display boards over! The Hungarian judge thought it was hilarious!

From then on, sadly things went downhill. Bristol in Bloom relied heavily on the City Council for financial support, and ever tightening local authority budgets combined with other priorities meant that the financial support from the Council was no longer there. The school competition went on for a few more years until the pandemic put an end to it. However we still have many It's Your Neighbourhood entries in Bristol, and we want to encourage more. In 2022 the Ardagh Community Garden won the Gordon Ford Trophy, and we have many other strong IYN entries. I believe that It's Your Neighbourhood is very much the future of Bloom, as it is free to enter, and can be on a small scale, and even with no funding at all you can still enter. All you need is enthusiastic volunteers and a site that they are working on to improve through horticulture and related activities.

I became a Bloom judge in 2012, judging the Cox Cup with Kim Parish. It was an awful summer, and it rained everywhere we went (so at least we saw everyone in the same light so to speak!). We judged in Mullion and Beer on the same day, and East Devon suffered floods, so the drive to Beer was interesting to say the least! I enjoyed it though, and was pleased to be asked back to judge the following year. I have judged most years since then apart from a year out, one for personal reasons and one because of the Covid pandemic. I co-ordinate It's Your Neighbourhoods in the Bristol and surrounding area, and enjoy being part of the Bloom community. It is like a big family, and we all try to support each other. One thing that I have learnt is that we are not just judging but also giving mentoring and support to the groups to help them achieve even better in future.

I have attached a few pictures, one of me on a judging tour, the rest are from entries that I have judged but no longer enter, which is a shame, they were all good entries.

Throughout recent years Vic Verrier has ben a stalwart member of the Regional Committee and we are indebted to him for his commitment and dedication.

We will also be presenting a Community Award to Japan on the Tuesday of the Chelsea Show, in recognition of their inaugural foray into Bloom.



The main aim of both Chelsea and Hampton Features is to promote friendship and inspire communities and gardeners to continue to develop projects, however small, throughout the UK.

Planting will feature highly, as will biodiversity, sustainability and art in the

landscape. Emphasis will be given to sustainable planting and use of primarily native trees. Herbs and vegetables will be interlaced with herbaceous and annual plantings. Wildflowers will also feature in both projects.

Planting has changed from high performance plants, to more long term herbaceous and native wild flower plantings. Edibles have too become more prevalent, but the key change is the move away from mono cultivars along with the need to diversify, good examples include planting not trees local apples. Turn to the concept of a "weed" as an unwanted plant, research its value first before removing it.

Above all is to have fun gardening. I would like to sincerely thank everyone involved in advance, and as this is written 20 days before Chelsea, my fingers are crossed for a good Feature.
