The Portfolio

The portfolio is an opportunity for you to gain extra marks and to support your entry. Through the portfolio you can show judges places you don't want to take them on the tour and demonstrate all year round involvement. Many groups find it very daunting and time consuming, it doesn't need to be.

It is a tool
Keep it simple

The Boring Bit

A4 in size (297 x 210mm)

Maximum 30 sides of A4, that gives you 30 sides but you don't have to use them all

We will need two copies, one for each judge

We recommend sending portfolios to your judges, at least 2 weeks before they come to judge you (remember you could be the last place judged & judges are likely to be away from home so by sending it early they are fully prepared before they start judging)

Portfolios are not normally returned

Optional, a maximum 5 pages of Appendices, 10 sides, for extra photo's, press cuttings, sample flyers, CD/DVDs etc.

Conclusion

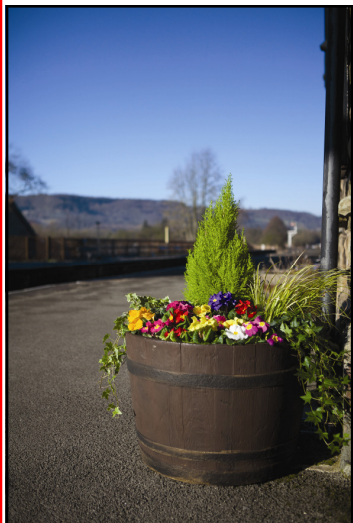

AMBEROL ROLL OUT THE BARREL.



An innovative new product has been developed to help those groups who are suffering from rot in their wooden barrels. A replica authentic wooden barrel has been developed and moulded from polyethylene in response to customer's requests.

The "Ambarrel" is a replica barrel made of roto-moulded polyethylene to ensure durability. It is moulded into a traditional half barrel shape measuring 45cms high with a 63cm diameter. The planter holds 100 litres of compost, making it ideal for both bedding plants and larger perennials. The hollow container has an interior membrane with a reservoir which can hold up to 20 litres of water. This means that if the reservoir is topped up just twice a week, the plants receive continual moisture using the aquafeed self watering system which was specially developed by Amberol.

During trials of the product, it received a very positive response from the Britain in Bloom campaign. We are always

pleased to support South West in Bloom and are happy to offer members of their campaign this stunning new product at an introductory price of £75 everyone should be able to benefit and roll out a barrel of fun to make their locality stand out from the crowd for years to come.

It was back in the 80s when I had my first taste of success in the Bath in bloom competition, I hadn't entered but in those days judges just walked the streets looking for floral displays on businesses and houses, in my case it was my business in Moorland Road and two pots of geraniums on the window ledge!. I was awarded a "Commended," a lowly start to my involvement with "The Bloom".

The two pots of geraniums soon became four and then hanging baskets and containers were planted and displayed, more awards came my way and soon my shop was famous! Within a few years the whole road was involved, I had two greenhouses built in my garden and grew over 5000 plants to use in displays on over fifty shops, Moorland Road won the Bath in bloom competition many times, this led to residents of our area showing interest, and this I suppose was the beginning of our very own community involvement. The Moorlands area entered Southwest in bloom and won our category for three years in a row, and in 1998 we represented the Southwest in the Britain in bloom national finals, unfortunately we were just beaten into 2nd place. My enthusiasm for "The Bloom" went undiminished as over the years it became obvious that Southwest and Britain in bloom were not just about flowers but about people, volunteers, schools and community groups, sustainable planting, biodiversity and recycling and the benefits to our villages, towns and Cities that came about as a result of the competitions.

Today "The Bloom" involves over 200,000 volunteers, it brings benefits to over 2,000,000 people, it involves 1,100 villages, towns and cities, and is responsible for 115,000 trees, 352,000 shrubs and 21,000,000 bulbs being planted per year! As well as litter picks, clean ups, graffiti removal etc etc, Staggering figures, but its statistics like this that make me every bit as enthusiastic today as I was back in the 80s.

Route Planning and Timing

Remember you will be judged on all the judges see on the route – the good, the bad and the ugly.

Before the judges arrive check the route but try not to be seen working ahead of the judges!

Allow time for the presentation and publicity photos at a special location.

Time the route carefully taking into account the fact that the judges may wish to talk, look harder or generally slow you down.

Don't be afraid to gently encourage them to keep to your timetable.

Take into account traffic and other hold ups.

Keep to the time allocation as close as possible – remember the judge will allow leeway but often will have a further judging after you – they will have allowed plenty of time to get there but cannot extend your time indefinitely.

Look at the criteria and ensure they all are represented throughout the route.

The judges like to meet as many people involved as possible – have them on the route where they can talk about their own areas and responsibilities.

If you specifically ask the judge to look in one direction at least one of them will look in the other!

During the judging arrange to have a cold drink available if it is hot or a hot drink if it's cold.

Provide the judges with route papers showing the route locations, what is there, who is there, which set of criteria they meet and room for the judges notes.

Start and finish at a good sites – first and last impressions count. Make sure you have a least one site with a 'Wow' factor.

The South West did us proud, again picking up a number of awards. (see full list elsewhere in newsletter) again well done to you all.

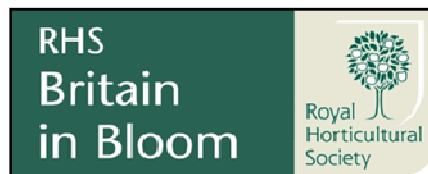

Mixed planting Schemes

Remember that your summer bedding schemes do not have to be designed using 100% bedding plants. Get inspiration from herbaceous plants, grasses, small shrubs, roses, vegetables and herbs, sculptures and art work.

Sunflowers are spectacular. Try getting height into a display by using sweet peas, runner beans and cape gooseberries to grow up frames. You can leave more permanent, taller plants in the centre of a display for several years to reduce the amount of bedding required.

Make light airy sculptures from materials that you might otherwise throw away, cans, bottles, old CD's and other household items.

Now is the time to get school children and their teachers, committee members, local artists and shops to come up with ideas. Have a theme or some sort of brief, it makes life easier. For instance it could be an anniversary of a well-known resident or business in your village/town city. Or you might want to celebrate the success of a sports person or team.

If you live near the sea you could have a "life on the ocean" theme. Someone will come up with a very good suggestion.

Use as many different materials as possible to create your displays to get that WOW factor.

The internet is full of ideas as well. Have fun and be adventurous!!!!!!

Well, what a year for Truro! We can honestly say that we believe this has been our most successful floral year, gaining Gold at regional level and becoming group winners of the Portman Cup. Then adding to the winning streak we won the Sponsors' Award for the Most Meritorious Effort.



This really set us in good stead for the first time in the Britain in Bloom National Competition since 1989. A large group of us set off for St Peter Port in Guernsey for the National Presentation hosted by the one and only Jon Wheatley, along with Roger Burnett and Geoff Bates and guest of honour Countryfile and The One Show's Matt Baker who was the main attraction of the night for the ladies! Not to be outdone, Jon Wheatley was wearing a large coloured shirt and sporting new glasses, looking very much like Harry Hill on stage.

As the town names were read out in alphabetical order, Truro was last to be called out. The Chairman Richard Argall and I went up to collect our award and we both seemed to have stopped breathing in anticipation of our result...TRURO – GOLD! We could not believe it; we had far exceeded the Silver Gilt we had expected.

On the Sunday we had the opportunity to meet the judges, who explained that Truro only missed out on winning the group by two points as Belper had scored one more point than us. Whether it was a few points or ten points off winning, we felt like we had won by gaining a National Gold.

After listening to the judges we will rectify the small items between us and Belper and will try to come back better and stronger, knowing how close we were. We will come back in a couple of years as next year we start major highway development and park and ride works which will adversely impact our entry.

We will be back!
